INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Removal of existing vegetation layer
- Levelling until sufficiently rooted
- Placing the flower carpet
- Keep flower carpet sufficiently hydrated immediately after placement and for the first 4 weeks until sufficiently rooted in
- Annual mowing in autumn to a height of 3 cm
- Immediate removal of all clippings
